The National Endowment for Financial Education (NEFE) invites researchers to submit grant proposals whose outcomes contribute to the body of knowledge in financial education and literacy. Special consideration will be given to project ideas that offer innovative and actionable financial education solutions. Recently NEFE's Board met and approved a redesigned grant program. A component of the redesign includes a more streamlined application process. Researchers are encouraged to submit a two-page Concept Inquiry Form by the June 19th, 2006 deadline. Inquiries of particular interest to the foundation will be directly relevant to outcomes of a national symposium NEFE conducted last fall titled Closing the Gap between Knowledge and Behavior: Turning Education into Action.
